Including works by Rabelais, Sir Thomas Browne, Goldsmith, Keats, Schiller, Ronald Ross, William Carlos Williams, and Dannie Abse, this beautifully produced limited edition was published to mark the 150th anniversary of the BMJ in 1990.

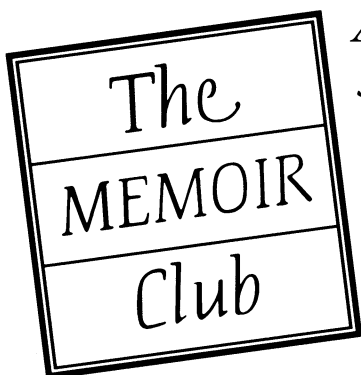
## **DR PHILLIPS: A MAIDA VALE IDYLL**

Supposedly based on rumoured events in the life of Ernest Hart, a great but undervalued editor of the *BMJ*, Frank Danby's novel was first published in 1887. Unlike many popular Victorian novels it is concisely plotted; its style is pithy; the characters are sympathetic and believable; and the author's presentation of Jewish life in the late nineteenth century is uncompromisingly honest. But is the character of "Dr Phillips" a portrait of Hart? In his introduction to this book Stephen Lock places the novel in its literary and historical context and examines the character and achievements of Ernest Hart.
