Appendix 1: Interview prompt guide.

- Perhaps you could begin by telling me how you became a surgeon/surgical trainee?
 Prompts and follow-up:
 - Was there a particular reason or moment that was important in deciding to become a surgeon?
 - Significant people, events etc.
 - o Tell me about your career journey to this point (how long, academic pathway etc)
- What things have supported your career/helped you to succeed?
- Have you faced any barriers?
